Founded in 1876 by John M. Rockwell and Charlotte Rockwell, the city is in the center of a rich agricultural area where the black soil yields wonderful large annual crops of corn and soybeans while livestock is raised to feed the world.

Rockwell City is located three miles south of the new four-lane U.S. Highway 20. Twin Lakes, along with a number of state and county parks, are located just five miles north of Rockwell City.

CALHOUN COUNTY MUSEUM *(see ad on pg. 3)

Take a step back in time and learn about our history with a visit to the Calhoun County Museum, located on the main road through Rockwell City. It is open from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays from April 28 to September 30.

LANDMARK DEPOT *(see ad on pg. 8)

The Rockwell City Landmark Depot, located on 4th Street, was built in 1899 and is open to visitors from June through October.

There were as many as four passenger trains a day, as well as freight trains running through the town.

The Milwaukee Depot is the only remaining depot of the original three. There are two buildings, which house artifacts donated by the community representing the history of Rockwell City's railroads.

It is the home of the Annual Show & Shine classic car show, which will be held this year on Saturday, July 13.

The depot also serves as the home of an antique tractor show during Sweet Corn Daze in August, and the Hobo Stew Supper on November 21.

FREEDOM ROCK

The Calhoun County Freedom Rock is a tourist destination, created by Ray "Bubba" Sorensen II, the artist of The Freedom Rock Tour, which aims to boost tourism and spread the message of thanking our Veterans while providing a "unique to their area" Freedom Rock for each of Iowa's 99 counties.

The Calhoun County Freedom Rock is located in downtown Rockwell City on the Calhoun County Courthouse grounds. It adorns the northwest corner of the square amid the Veterans' Memorial Park honoring Veterans of the county, state and members of Calhoun County families.

The beautiful park is surrounded by flying flags representing all branches of the U.S. military, along with benches from supporting individuals and businesses.

The community's donations have made the Calhoun County Freedom Rock and Veterans' Memorial Park a success, and its ongoing care is a project of the Calhoun County Supervisors and Rockwell City Chamber & Development.

AIRPORT

Rockwell City Municipal Airport is the only airport located in Calhoun County and is owned by the City of Rockwell City. The airport is located on the southeast edge of town and has a 3,500-foot runway with three tie downs.

ROCKWELL CITY CHAMBER & DEVELOPMENT

More than 90 chamber members make up and support the very active Rockwell City Chamber & Development organization.

They are focused on promoting the community, along with existing and potential businesses and industries, to improve the quality of life in the Rockwell City area. They also support and assist clubs, service groups and organizations that work toward the betterment of the Rockwell City community.

ROCKWELL CITY POOL

The Rockwell City Pool is open from May until the end of August and features a baby pool, slide and diving board. The pool is located next to Kid's Kingdom Park playground, the fairgrounds, Patrick E. Minnick Walk Park and RV Park.

ROCKWELL CITY LIBRARY


The mission of the Rockwell City Public Library is to serve as an innovative, dynamic resource, central to a literate and informed citizenry.

Lake City is located in the southwest corner of Calhoun County on State Highway 175 and County Road N-41. Rich Iowa soil and green rolling hills surround the residential and commercial heart of the community, which offers something for everyone to enjoy.

Founded in 1856 by Peter and Christian Smith, Lake City is the oldest and most historic town in Calhoun County. The name and town motto "Everything But a Lake" came from the drainage of a pond near the beginning of the town's history.

Although Lake City does not boast its own lake, it is situated within 25 minutes of three beautiful lakes – Twin Lakes, Black Hawk Lake and Swan Lake – all great fishing and recreational spots. In keeping with its historic character, there are several homes and community buildings on the National Register of Historic Places for you to visit and enjoy.

LAKE CITY PUBLIC POOL

At the Lake City Public Pool, located in Goins Park, you can spend a summer day relaxing at the pool or cruise down the water slide. The pool offers a zero-depth entry, lap pool with six swimming lanes, open flume water slide, diving board, climbing wall, basketball hoops, sprinkler water features, bathhouse, concession area and shade structures.

LAKE CITY PUBLIC LIBRARY

The Lake City Public Library, situated on the north side of the city square, provides a wealth of services to the community and visitors, including numerous children's programs and adult learning classes.

A large meeting room is the venue for a wide variety of events, and a conference room is available for smaller meetings and group study.



TOWN SOUARE

Located in the heart of the city, directly on Highway 175, the one-of-a-kind square is home to many community events and gatherings.

A replica bandstand constructed by volunteers matches the original structure erected in 1887. A fountain, similar to the original built in 1914, sits in the center of the square.

A memorial to veterans features military statues and American flags.







HISTORIC CENTRAL SCHOOL

Built in 1884, the Italinate style structure had served as one of the main school buildings for nearly a century, before becoming a cultural center. It was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1985.

Central School is located one block off of the city square on South Center Street.

RAINBOW PARK AND RAINBOW BRIDGE

Located three miles south of town on Iberia Avenue, Rainbow Park is named for the beautiful and historic Marsh Rainbow Arch Bridge. Also known as the Coon River Bridge and Rainbow Bend Access, the bridge crosses the Raccoon River. The bridge was erected in 1914, used for vehicular traffic until 1983 and is placed on the National Register of Historic Places. It is a great location for fishing along the river, picnicking in the outdoors and primitive camping.

According to local legend, Rainbow Bridge is the home of a ghost with a taste for chocolate.

If you bring an unopened chocolate bar at midnight, lay it in the center of the bridge and leave, it has been said that when you return after a five-minute period, the chocolate will be missing from the inside but the wrapper still intact and unopened.

WESTERN DAYS *(see ad on pg. 23)

The Top Rail Saddle Club, Lake City Betterment Association and many community members team up to bring fun and entertainment to Lake City during Western Days weekend: a rodeo on Saturday and Sunday, two-mile fun-run, delicious food, a big parade, shopping specials, craft and vendor sales, fireworks, community worship, street dance, beer garden and much more.

The Top Rail Saddle Club, established in 1959, is one of very few clubs in the nation that continue to manage and produce a rodeo with a local group of volunteers.

CAPRI THEATRE *(see ad on pg. 10)

The Capri is a community-run, volunteer-led movie theater located on the west side of the square.

It features current releases every Friday, Saturday and Sunday for \$2 a seat, with all of your favorite theater concession goodies available for purchase.

The community of Manson is ideally located on Highway 7 between Fort Dodge and Twin Lakes, just 10 miles west of the ever-growing North Central Ag Industrial Park featuring C.J. Bio America, Cargill and Valero.

Manson offers a small town community with big city amenities such as an aquatic center, golf course, community and fitness center, excellent educational system and athletic facilities, quality housing and is home to six churches.

Manson offers safe, accessible public areas, a strong musical heritage, active youth programs and is close to numerous recreational amenities, including the Twin Lakes Recreation Area being just a short 10-minute drive away. Manson's business district features retail stores, banks, restaurants, as well as insurance, legal, real estate, medical, pharmacy and newspaper services.

The Manson Economic Development Corporation works closely with the city to promote the development of industry, business and housing. Manson offers a 100 percent residential tax abatement on all new construction for the first five years, and a commercial tax abatement is also available.

RECREATION

The City of Manson provides four city parks. Recreational facilities available in the parks include a wide variety of playground equipment, ball diamonds and lighted tennis courts.

Manson has an active playground committee that continues to update the local playgrounds to meet the needs of today's youth.

The Manson Aquatic Center provides a modern pool and water play area for adults and children alike.

The facility is open throughout the summer months and features a zero-entry play area with fountains for toddlers, two slides, low and high diving boards, swim lanes, shade umbrellas, a modern bathhouse and snack bar.

LOCAL GROUPS

Manson's strong musical heritage has been vibrant for more than 125 years, with the focal group being the Manson Meridian Singers. The Meridian Singers organization was established in 1972 and entertains annually in January or February to sold out audiences.

Several local service clubs include cultural programs during their meetings such as Woman's Club, P.E.O., Beta, and Lions Club. The WaTanYe Club sponsors the annual craft show featuring local artists and crafters whose works may be purchased.

MANSON PUBLIC LIBRARY

Since it was established in 1909, the Manson Public Library has seen many changes while always providing excellent service to the community.

In addition to a wide selection of books and magazines for adults and children, the library provides computers for public use, Internet access (including Wi-Fi), and a large collection of videos, audio books and eBooks. The library staff offers excellent children's programs, a Readers Circle book discussion group and game and craft nights. MANSON IMPACT STRUCTURE

The Manson Impact Structure is one of the largest known meteorite craters in the continental United States. Measuring more than 24 miles in diameter, the crater is believed to have been created when a stony meteorite that seared through the atmosphere crashed into the Earth some 74 million years ago.

The meteorite spanned approximately 1.5 miles in diameter, weighed close to 10 billion tons, and was traveling at a rate of 45,000 miles per hour when it hit. The unusual geology of the land surrounding the Manson structure was discovered in 1912, when the town water well was drilled to find rock samples of thick shale above granite rock.

In 1953, experts concluded that the crater's crypto volcanic structure produced a giant blast of volcanic gas. Granite and other rocks normally found several thousand feet below ground were brought up to within less than 200 feet of the surface by the impact.

Glacial deposits have filled the crater while erosion has leveled it off. The crater is about 200 feet below the rich Calhoun County farmland.

Due to limestone layers being vaporized down to the basement rocks, Manson boasts the softest water in Iowa.

Visitors will often ask City Staff where the "Meteor" is and receive the standard response: "You're standing on it!"

Ten thousand years ago, when glacial ice sheets melted, they left deposits of clay, gravel and rock dust in the depressions formed in the plains by glacial movement. America's few walled glacial blue lakes were formed by nature.

Iowa has two of three such lakes in the world, North Twin Lake and West Okoboji. The third glacial blue lake is Lake Como, located in Switzerland, on the border near Italy.

Experts believe that North and South Twin were at one time one lake, five times as large as the present lakes. Season by season, as the waters froze and thawed, more soil and rocks were pushed to the edges, gradually building a shore wall.

North Twin Lake has a clay and sand bottom, which covers 570 acres. The lake is owned by the State of Iowa and is 2.9 miles long with shoreline of approximately seven miles. There are about 334 private homes on the lake.





Established in 1870 and named for Charles W. Pomeroy, landowner and congressman. Pomeroy is situated among the cornfields and wind turbines of northwest Iowa. In Pomeroy's infancy, the rustle and bustle of new growth was evident on every corner with new businesses, homes and churches sprouting up from the flat rich prairies of Calhoun County. The Railroad was instrumental in Pomeroy's success by bridging the gap between small rural towns and larger cities, taking passengers to Fort Dodge and hauling cattle to Chicago.

THE 1893 TORNADO

On a warm summer evening in July of 1893, an F5 tornado descended upon Pomeroy with a damage path 500 yards wide destroying 80% of the homes and leaving in its wake 71 dead and more than 200 injured. Many members of some families were killed and babies without parents were given to other families to raise. The cemeteries in and around Pomeroy have many tombstones that are dated July 6, 1893, or soon after. A small tornado display is set up in the town's Mini Mall located on Ontario Street, and more information about the storm can be found at the Pomeroy Historical Society Museum, located in the former First National Bank. The Museum is open for tours during Memorial Day weekend and the second weekend of July for the Pomeroy Homecoming weekend.






LIBRARY



KNIERIM

Knierim was founded by William and Wilhelmina in 1899, and incorporated in 1901. In 1934, Bonnie and Clyde robbed the Knierim Bank of \$272. The bank exists today as a private residence. Knierim is north of U.S. Highway 20 and south of Iowa Highway 7, along Xavier Avenue.

KNOKE

POPULATION: 21

Knoke is an unincorporated community in Calhoun County. Founded in 1901 by William Knoke, the community is located four and a half miles southwest of Pomeroy. According to the community's welcome sign, its population was 21 as of 2001. The welcome sign advertises that Knoke is available via the next three exits, which are the streets "Knoke Main," "Knoke Drive," and "Knoke Road."

RINARD

POPULATION: 50 • (515) 467-5654

Rinard lies south of U.S. Highway 20 on County Road D46, southwest of Somers. Rinard was platted in 1904, and was a key shipping point as it was located at the junction of the Chicago Great Western and the Fort Dodge, Des Moines & Southern railways.

SOMERS

POPULATION: 106 • (515) 544-3789

Located between Rinard and Knierim, Somers is located one mile south of U.S. Highway 20 on County Road P21. Somers was platted in 1900 as a shipping point on the railroad. The Somers Library exhibits include World War I and World War II articles.

YETTER

POPULATION: 32

"Everything's Better in Yetter." Founded in 1899, the town was named after its founder, L.M. Yetter. The Farmer's Co-op fertilizer plant includes a mile and a half of railroad siding for 110 cars.



LAKE CITY

The Genevra Davis-Max Elder Walking Trail is a half-mile path on the grounds of Shady Oaks and Stewart Memorial Community Hospital. While there, enjoy the SMCH Memorial Garden.

The Lake City Recreational Trail was created by designating three miles of city streets and extended to include the hospital/Shady Oaks Trail and Michael Macke Memorial Park.

The next goal for the group is to extend the trail to the Opportunity Living Trail, and the group continues to raise funds to make that connection happen.

LOHRVILLE

The Ralph Earwood Memorial Trail is 13.5 acres of abandoned railroad bed converted to a paved three-quarter mile walking path lined by trees, shrubs and grass. It is fully handicap-accessible, with parking available at both ends of the trail.

In 2018, the new Kinney/Mohr Trail started to offer a .32 mile extension.

MANSON

The City Walk Park features a butterfly garden and historical displays. It is located on Highway N65 following the former railroad bed.

ROCKWELL CITY

The Patrick E. Minnick Walk Park is located next to the city pool, RV park and Kid's Kingdom Park playground, near the Calhoun County Fairgrounds.

TWIN LAKES

Take in the scenery with a trip around the seven-mile Twin Lakes Trail, which encompasses the beautiful North Twin Lake. The trail passes the Knapp Round Barn – a restored barn on the property of the Twin Lakes Christian Center – and connects to the Gutz Prairie, Treman Park, West Twin Lake State Park and Featherstone Park. Reservations must be made three days before arrival. The two large cabins sleep 10 and include tables, chairs, refrigerator, oven, microwave, sink and its own shower. The large cabins must be reserved for a week during the busy season (Memorial Day to Labor Day). Each cabin is allowed to have a tent as well. All are close to a comfort station, a fishing dock and playground equipment. Cabins open annually on April 1st. Reservations can be made at mycountyparks.com. Featherstone Park on North Twin Lake also offers sites for RVs and tents. There are 79 electrical and water sites, as well as many tent spots. Located in the park are comfort stations, swimming, boating, fishing and trails. The park is overseen by the Calhoun County Conservation.

THE MICHAEL MACKE MEMORIAL CAMPGROUND

Located just west of Lake City on County Road N37 and Lake Creek. This park has 5 RV spots with electrical hookups and the spaces may also be used for tent camping. Fire pits and a playground are on site. There is also a very well-maintained bathroom, complete with showers and a shaded picnic area. Being right on Lake Creek, makes fishing a great opportunity at this park!

FISHING AT TWIN LAKES

North Twin Lake offers 570 acres of fishing opportunities. It is regularly stocked with fish by the State Conservation Commission with walleye, northern pike, catfish, bass and tiger muskie. Through natural reproduction there are bullhead, crappie and yellow bass.




