## PROCEEDINGS: ROCKWELL CITY COUNCIL • JULY 5 MINUTES & CLAIMS

## ROCKWELL CITY JULY 5, 2022 • 5:30 p.m.

Mayor Heinlen called the meeting to order with the following members present: Fowler, Gentry, Fistler and Rokes. Absent – Porter. Motion by Rokes, second by Fistler, to approve the agenda, unanimous.

Motion by Fowler, second by Fistler, to approve the consent agenda consisting of the July 17 meeting minutes, bills as submitted and Las Flores, unanimous.

Motion by Rokes, second by Gentry, to approve the first reading of Ordinance 388 that amends Chapter 165.10, Section 4: R-1 – Bulk Regulations – allowing for fiftyfoot lots with Council approval. Roll Call. Ayes – Fowler, Gentry, Fistler and Rokes. Nays – none.

Motion by Gentry, second by Rokes, to wave the 2nd and 3rd reading for Ordinance 388, unanimous.

Motion by Fistler, second by Rokes, to forgive the excess sewer for account #430002 for June, July and August for watering her trees,

## unanimous.

Motion by Gentry, second by Fistler, to forgive the excess sewer for account #952003, due to a broken hose, unanimous.

Motion by Gentry, second by Fowler, to deny a request to forgive water for account #661003 due to an outdoor hose that was left on, unanimous. The Council does not forgive water as there would have been a cost incurred to producing the water.

Ricky Kraft asked the Council why his request for a fence at 327 South Street was denied. The Council told him his property at 327 & 328 had been condemned and he does not have water, sewer and electricity at either property since he owned them.

Motion by Rokes, second by Fowler, to approve a total of a 24foot curb cut (including the current cut) at 704 5th Street, unanimous.

The Council tabled discussion on new flooring for the pilot's lounge at the airport until new windows are installed and it is painted.

A Council member said that the

Congregate meals staff is retiring at the end of the year and new staff will need to be hired.

Motion by Rokes, second by Fistler, to approve a contract with New Coop for \$2,000/year to use Airport Grounds for spraying, unanimous.

Mayor Heinlen called for further business, and with none, motion by Gentry, second by Fistler to adjourn the meeting at 5:50 p.m., unanimous. Next meeting will be Monday, July 17, 2022 at 5:30 at City Hall.
