

PUBLIC NOTICE: CITY OF LAKE CITY REMINDER OF KEY ORDINANCES

Reminder for Lake City Residents:

The City of Lake City would like to remind residents of a few city ordinances that often result in complaints upon violation.

• Municipal Code: 6-10-1, 6-10-2, and 6-10-3 require the mowing of property within the City when grass is longer than 8 inches. Properties not mowed in accordance with the code shall be mowed by the City or our agents, and billed to the property owner.

• GRASS CLIPPINGS. Municipal Code 3-1-5 (3) prohibits grass clippings from being deposited in the street. The reason for this regulation is because the grass will plug the storm sewers.

• TREE TRIMMING. Municipal Code 6-13-4 requires property owners to keep tree branches trimmed at least 15 feet above the street and 8 feet above the sidewalks.

• TREE PLANTING. Be sure to check with the City for rules before planting trees in the parking strip (area between lot line and curb line).

• LEASH LAW. Municipal Code 4-1-6 prohibits dogs, from running at large within the city limits and requires the use of a leash when a dog is outside of a building or not in an enclosed yard.

SOLID WASTE REMOVAL OF ANIMALS. Municipal Code 4-1-13 requires removal and disposal of animal feces from public property or the property of another person. When walking your dog, please always carry a plastic bag with you.
ANNOYANCE OR DISTUR-BANCE. Municipal Code 4-1-11 requires animal owners to ensure their animals do not create a serious annoyance or disturbance to any person or disrupt the peace and good order of the community by making loud noises, including regular, frequent, continual, or habitual barking, yelping, yowling, or howling. · GOLF CARTS, lowa Code Section 321.174 states that only those with a valid driver's license may operate a golf cart upon streets and highways. PROPERTY CLEANUP. Please keep your property free of junk and junk vehicles. The City has junk, nuisance, and dangerous building ordinances to aid in maintaining a clean community.
