ROCKWELL CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

June 3, 2024 5:30 P.M. Mayor Heinlen called the meeting to order with the following members present: Fowler, Porter, Gentry, Rokes, and Fistler.

Motion by Rokes, second by Fistler, to approve the agenda, unanimous. Motion by Fistler, second by Fowler, to approve the consent agenda consisting of the May 20 meeting minutes, bills as submitted and approval of Class E Retail Alcohol License – Kimmes Rockwell City Country Store and Special Class C Retail Alcohol License – Top of Iowa Lucky Wife for Calhoun County Expo, unanimous.

Motion by Porter, second by Rokes, to approve *Resolution 24-19 Fire Department Capital Improvement*. Roll Call. Ayes - Fowler, Porter, Gentry, Rokes, and Fistler.

Motion by Gentry, second by Fowler, to allow the Folden family to place a picnic table or bench in the park in memory of their mother, unanimous. The Council discussed repairs that are needed at the pool and bidding

those repairs. The Clerk will continue to collect costs and look into the financing process. In the meantime, some of the City employees are fundraising to help with the repairs.

The Council discussed some complaints about damaged or misplaced stones in the Catholic Cemetery. After some discussion of findings by the Maintenance department and the Council, motion by Gentry, second by Fowler, to deny a request to repair the stones, unanimous.

The owner of 325 Main Street requested permission to hook a temporary meter to the City Hall building to power wash his building, etc. Motion by Fowler, second by Rokes, to allow him to use a City-owned meter, unanimous. They agreed he must pay a monthly minimum, store the meter safely in between uses and return the meter to City Hall before it freezes for the season. Next year he will nee to come to the Council to discuss if they will allow him to use a temporary meter again.

Motion by Gentry, second by Porter, to allow Amvets to close Court Street in front of their building for Corn Daze, unanimous.

Motion by Fowler, second by Rokes, to close 4th Street in front of the Fire Department for the Hometown Heroes Ride, unanimous.

Motion by Rokes, second by Fistler, to approve a disaster proclamation for the storm on May 24 in order to request aid for clearing trees, running generators, etc., unanimous.

The Maintenance department discussed the need to make necessary improvements for electrical outages to the water system. The Council asked them to get pricing for the necessary changes.

Dave King, Public Works updated the Council on the DNR lead service line inventory that he has been working on since he received it May of 2022. He told the Council he needs to report his findings to DNR by October 2024.

The Mayor told the Council that the lights on the Hwy 20 City signs have been updated and appear to be working.

Mayor Heinlen called for further business, and with none, motion by Fistler, second by Fowler, to adjourn the meeting at 6:00 PM, unanimous. The next regular meeting will be held Monday, June 17 5:30 PM at City Hall. Phil R. Heinlen Mayor
