Batz, County Auditor</p>	<p>SOUTH CENTRAL CALHOUN BOARD OF DIRECTORS REGULAR MEETING OCTOBER 21, 2024</p> <p>The South Central Calhoun Board of Directors met in a Regular Meeting on Mon, Oct 21, 2024, at the SCC MS media center. President Judy Hungate called the meeting to order at 6 pm. Director members present included Vice-President Roger McKinney, Jason Hawkins, Keaton Hildreth, Jeffrey Redenius and Nick Spencer. Supt Brad Anderson, Board Secretary Carol Collins and several guests were present. Director Ryan Hammen was absent with regret. Hildreth motioned, McKinney seconded, to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried 6-0. The Board recited the Pledge of Allegiance and Hawkins read the SCC Mission Statement: <i>The mission of the South Central Calhoun School District is to partner with our communities to provide an environment rich with opportunities that challenge every student to master skills and understandings which will transfer into a successful future .</i> Public Input on Non-agenda Items There were no requests to speak. <u>Board Secretary</u> Secretary Collins shared the IASB Convention details from Nov 20-22. <u>Student Council</u> Student Council Sponsor DJ Erkenbrack reviewed feedback from Homecoming and activities on the Service Day. <u>Skilled Trades Readiness</u> Instructors Mandy Maile and Alissa Promes shared the development process and implementation of the new Skilled Trades Readiness course at the HS following contact with a trades union representative from the Des Moines area. Students will earn a pre-apprenticeship certificate as a foundation to employment and further training. Skills include math, reading and writing skills necessary for many skilled jobs and careers. The students attended the Skilled Trades Apprenticeship Expo for hands-on demonstrations and connections with various employers. The Board thanked Maile and Promes for their commitment to students and for their willingness to provide this important course at SCC. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS HS Principal Sara Pibal updated the Board on the Service Day on Oct 16. Later in the day, students watched a film related to cell phone use and effects on mental health. Assessment data for reading and math were discussed. A proposal to redesign fall Parent-Teacher Conferences at the HS was shared. Elementary Principal Nicole McChesney reported on attendance and the PS process for IQ4K Level 5 approval to assess the quality and effectiveness of programming. MS Principal Marc DeMoss updated the Board on the annual Veteran's Day program on Nov 11 at 1:30 pm. Students and staff participated in the Annual Healthiest State Walk on Oct 3. Supt Anderson reviewed classified staff trainings on Oct 28 during the no school day and reminded the Board of the SIAC meeting on Thursday evening at the elementary. DISCUSSION ITEMS <u>Cell Phone Policy</u> Supt Anderson recommended an update to the cell phone policy related to elementary students on school buses. The change would allow all students to use cell phones on buses with expectations of proper behavior. <u>Ruth Bartels Donation</u> Supt Anderson shared photos of the four trees planted at the Lytton athletic complex from the Ruth Bartels Estate donation. Updates on use of the funds will be provided in the future. <u>Football Game Supervision</u> Supt Anderson updated the Board on supervision discussions of younger students at home FB games. The Board expressed the need to reduce unsupervised play while encouraging families to attend and watch the FB game.</p> <p>Additional communication will be developed before next fall with a clear set of expectations shared with students and families. <u>SIAC Meetings</u> The first SIAC meeting is Thu, Oct 24, at the elementary. While a majority of the Board may be in attendance, it will not be an official meeting and proper notice will be given. <u>IASB Convention</u> The delegate assembly is Nov 20 with Vice-President McKinney scheduled to attend. Other members are encouraged to attend if personal schedules provide the opportunity. Motion carried 6-0. <u>Cell Phone Policy Update</u> Spencer motioned, McKinney seconded, to approve the recommended language change to allow elementary students to use cell phones on school transportation. Motion carried 6-0. <u>Student Information System</u> Following discussion, Redenius motioned, Hawkins seconded, to approve the proposed bids from Infinite Campus as presented to train and transition during the current school year for implementation in 2025-26. Motion carried 6-0. <u>Shared Girls Wrestling</u> Spencer motioned, Hildreth seconded, to approve the agreement with Southeast Valley for girls wrestling as presented. Motion carried 6-0. <u>Long-Term Sub Pay</u> Hildreth motioned, McKinney seconded, to approve a long-term substitute teacher rate of \$220 per day after 10 days in the same assignment. Motion carried 6-0. <u>EL Allowable Growth Request</u> McKinney motioned, Hawkins seconded, to approve the FY24 English Learner Modified Allowable Growth request of \$56,407.46 as presented. Motion carried 6-0. <u>Employee Handbook Update</u> Hawkins motioned, Hildreth seconded, to approve the language update related to employee reporting of workplace injuries to reflect current practice as presented. Motion carried 6-0.
